ALICIA JOHN-BAPTISTE NAMED CHIEF OF INFRASTRUCTURE, CLIMATE AND MOBILITY

SAN FRANCISCO– Today, Mayor-elect Daniel Lurie announced the latest appointment in his administration, naming Alicia John-Baptiste, the current President and Chief Executive Officer of the San Francisco Bay Area Planning and Urban Research Association (SPUR), Chief of Infrastructure, Climate and Mobility. The news follows recent leadership appointment <u>announcements</u> as well as the Mayor-elect's <u>plans</u> to restructure the office of the mayor to enhance effectiveness and accountability.

The Infrastructure, Climate and Mobility Chief will coordinate the strategic alignment of a portfolio of departments with a focus on the following key priorities – making the city more mobile through efficient and effective services, utilizing infrastructure projects as a vehicle for economic growth and to meet climate and resiliency goals.

"I am thrilled to be returning to government service at such a critical time for the future of San Francisco," **said Alicia John-Baptiste, Chief of Infrastructure, Climate and Mobility.** "How the City plans for and delivers on its major infrastructure, climate, and mobility goals will shape our vitality for years to come and I'm looking forward to partnering with the Mayor-elect and City leadership on this important work. I'm also excited to directly implement a recommendation from SPUR's good government work by joining the newly-created team of policy chiefs." In this role, John-Baptiste will coordinate the following departments: Environment, Municipal Transportation Agency, Port of San Francisco, Public Utilities Commission, Public Works, Recreation & Parks.

"Alicia is an incredible leader. She has the deep knowledge and expertise to help this Administration achieve its audacious goals," **said Tomiquia Moss, Secretary, California Business, Consumer Services and Housing Agency.** "She has a rare understanding of how the civic sector works - both inside and outside of government. I have worked with Alicia in several roles over the years to improve the Bay Area and have witnessed her deep commitment to community. She will be an asset to San Francisco in this new role."
